In a year fraught with political uncertainty and social anxiety, CaringWorks proved to be an anchor in the storm for nearly 800 individuals experiencing chronic homelessness in metro Atlanta. Staying true to our mission, we provided decent, affordable housing and relevant behavioral and social services that helped heal and uplift. As a result, homelessness became history for hundreds of households who are now meeting or exceeding goals for self-sufficiency and well-being.

The future appears to be very bright for Caring Works. We expect to serve nearly 1,000 clients in 2019, increasing our current capacity by an estimated 25 percent! In our perpetual pursuit of excellence, this growth must be thoughtfully managed. We must hold on to the values that have gotten us this far while




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ANNUAL HIGHLIGHTS

- Earned two awards for service quality and innovation: the Community Impact Award from Georgians for a Healthy Future and the Bridge Builder Award from the Georgia Alliance to End Homelessness.
- Earned a three-year re-accreditation from CARF, the fourth threeyear term since 2009.
- Behavioral Health Team scored 99 on the annual Medicaid audit, surpassing the statewide average score of 88.
- Earned a new SAMHSA grant of \$500K a year for five years!
- Awarded a new permanent supportive housing program from the City of Atlanta.
- Developed two new initiatives with community providers—Step Up Atlanta and First Step Staffing.
